SUMMIT COUNTY LIBRARY BOOKMOBILE RETURNS TO SERVICE

Summit County, UT— The Summit County Library Bookmobile will resume service to Summit County patrons beginning the day after Labor Day, Tuesday, September 7th. Previous concerns about the vehicle’s safety due to manufacturer design defects in its suspension have been addressed. The modifications to the vehicle have been performed in accordance with the manufacturer’s warranty coverage, and the vehicle has been determined to be safe to operate. The Bookmobile attended North Summit Elementary’s Back-to-School Night on Tuesday, August 24th and will also visit the new Weilenmann School’s Back-to-School Night on Thursday, September 16th. The Bookmobile serves the outlying Summit County communities, the Seniors Centers in Coalville and Park City, and students at North and South Summit Elementary Schools, Park City Day School, Weilenmann School of Discovery, Soaring Wings Montessori School (Jeremy Ranch Campus), Keystone Community Pre-school and the Shining Stars Pre-school. Outreach Services Librarian Lee Whiting said, “I am very much looking forward to getting back into the schools and bringing books to the students, and sharing my love for books and reading with them.”
